CEO Brian Krzanich following his violation of the company's non-fraternization policy, Weiner provides a breakdown of non-fraternization policies and explains why more companies, large and small, are beginning to implement them.

***Do most big companies like Intel have such rules? Most companies the size of Intel will have some variation of non-fraternization rules, and many organizations much smaller than Intel have them too. However, the type of fraternization policy will vary drastically depending on the size, purpose and public visibility of the organization.***

***How are they applied? I.e. do workers at the lower levels adhere to them, or are they typically limited to managers and execs?***

*Naturally, non-fraternization policies are most often applied to the conduct of high-level managers and executives, who generally have the most influence and power within the organization. Yet, it's not uncommon for employers implement and enforce rules that apply to all employees.*
